Discover the beautiful "golden slopes" of Burgundy's famed Côte d'Or with tastings at the best estates of legendary appellations like **Meursault**, **Gevrey Chambertin**, **Puligny Montrachet or Vosne Romanée**. From the impressive 13th century wine presses of the **Clos de Vougeot** to the stunning renaissance architecture of the **Hospices de Beaune**, you'll discover the rich cultural heritage and history of this region so exalted by wine lovers. Get to know major appellations of Bordeaux as you taste at some of the most prestigious estates of the **Graves**, **Médoc**, **Sauternes** and **St. Emilion** region. From Classified Growths to Cru Bourgeois Exceptionnels, this tour offers a fantastic overview of the best that Bordeaux has to offer. But it doesn't stop there! You'll also enjoy gourmet dining and **first-class accommodations** in both regions. This is a fantastic overview of the best of these two magnificent regions.





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DAY 1

Welcome to Burgundy~Côte de Nuits

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- Arrival at the Dijon train station, about 1.5 hours from Paris, where you'll be greeted by your English-speaking, wine
 expert guide/driver. (We suggest arriving around 10am and we can assist you with rail suggestions once you book your tour).
- Your first tour and tasting will be at a local estate in the Côte de Nuits. **The Côte de Nuits** region is best known for its Grand Cru red wines made from **100% Pinot Noir grapes**. The finest reds produced here are powerful, medium-bodied, with a subtle but good tannic structure.
- Enjoy a lovely **welcome lunch** at a charming country inn featuring specialties of the region. Depart for the historic **Clos de Vougeot**. This beautiful 13th century monastery is now owned by the **Confrérie du Tastevin**, the famous wine brotherhood of Burgundy. During a fascinating guided tour of the Clos, learn how wine was made in the Middle Ages and see their massive 13th century wine presses that still work to this day!
- Afterward, you'll taste Premier and Grand Cru wines at one of the best producers of Grand Cru appellation Clos de Vougeot, Gevrey Chambertin or Vosne Romanée, followed by a walk along the renowned vineyards of Domaine de la Romanée Conti.
- Check in late afternoon to your luxury 4-star hotel conveniently located in the historic city of Beaune
- Take the evening to enjoy the charming town of Beaune and discover its great restaurants, with our suggestions.

DAY 2 Côte de Beaune B, L

- Meet your guide and tour one of the **great négociant (wine merchant) houses of Burgundy, like Louis Jadot or Bouchard Père et Fils** (in the magnificent, totally private, 15th century Château de Beaune). A tasting of some of their great wines will complete your visit.
- Explore the **Côte de Beaune** today, home to the greatest Grand Cru white wine vineyards like the legendary **Montrachet**, as well as the famous appellations of Meursault, Puligny-Montrachet and Volnay.
- The Côte de Beaune is best known for its great white wines made from **100% Chardonnay** grapes, perfectly suited to the limestone soils. The **whites of the Côte de Beaune** are full-bodied, with tremendous elegance, complexity and minerality. The **reds** are generally more feminine and lighter-bodied than in the Côte de Nuits, with softer tannins.
- You'll taste at one of this area's top estates that best exemplify the terroir of the region.
- Enjoy a fun and informative wine tasting lunch of delicious local specialties at a local domaine, with up to 12 wines beautifully paired with your meal, including Grand Cru wines.
- Weather permitting, spend time in the vineyards discovering the **golden slopes of the Côte de Beaune**, and the iconic parcels that make these vineyards legendary.
- Return to your hotel for an evening on your own.

DAY 3

Beaune~Transfer to Bordeaux

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- Enjoy a **free morning in the charming city of Beaune**. Tour the fascinating Hospices de Beaune, with its beautiful 15th century architecture; check out the Athenaeum, France's best wine accessory and gift shop; or just wander the streets and enjoy Beaune's many shops and galleries.
- Meet your driver and transfer to Lyon, and connect to Bordeaux by plane.
- Meet your driver as you exit baggage claim and transfer to your hotel in Bordeaux: the 5* completely renovated
 Grand Hotel and Spa de Bordeaux, conveniently located in the heart of the historic district of Bordeaux. Or, if you prefer, you may choose accommodations in the countryside surrounded by vineyards.
- Evening on own.



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DAY 4 Graves and Sauternes B, L

- Travel south to the **vineyards of the Graves Region**. The Romans planted some of the first vineyards in the Bordeaux area here, just outside what is now the city limits.
- Here you will be the guests of **Classified Grand Cru Château**, such as **Château Smith Haut Lafitte or Château La Louviere** where a great tour and tasting awaits you.
- Enjoy a **welcome lunch at a local restaurant** in the area, wines included.
- Continue on to **Sauternes**, the most famous sweet dessert wine appellation in the world. Learn how these delectable wines are made using grapes that have developed the "Noble Rot" during a fascinating tour at one of the best Châteaux in the area (like **Guiraud**, or **Suduiraut**), followed by a tasting. If you prefer not to discover the sweet wine region of Bordeaux, we will discover more estates in the Graves region.
- Return to your hotel in the late afternoon for evening on your own.

DAY 5 The Mighty Médoc

- Today we explore the **Médoc**, world-renowned for its Classified Growth Châteaux, following the "Route des Châteaux" through the famous villages of **Margaux**, **Pauillac and Saint Julien**.
- Your first tour and tasting will be at a **Grand Cru Châteaux as their VIP guests** at a classified estate in Margaux such as **Château Palmer**. Margaux is the largest of the six regions of the Médoc, and the farthest south. The 1,470 or so lucky people who live there reside in one of the most famous wine making regions on earth.
- We continue with tours and tastings towards Pauillac and St. Julien. **Pauillac** is maybe the best known appellation of Bordeaux with three 1st great growths out of 5: Château Lafite, Château Latour and Château Mouton-Rothschild.
- Slightly less powerful than Pauillac yet not as rustic as Saint-Estèphe, **Saint-Julien** wines are very aromatized. They are harmonious and well balanced red wines. Saint-Julien is the right balance between Pauillac and Margaux.
- A special treat awaits you today: a **private wine tasting lunch** at one of the best estates in the region. Your meal will be served in the kitchen or dining room of the château, and prepared especially for you by the **private chef of the estate**, and paired beautifully with library wines of the estate.
- Return to your hotel in the late afternoon for evening on your own.

DAY 6 St. Emilion and Pomerol B

- Known since Roman times for the quality of its wines, the village and vineyards of **Saint Emilion are designated today as a UNESCO World Heritage Site**. Saint Emilion has some of Bordeaux's oldest vineyards, producing well-structured wines with great character that comes from a judicious **blending of Cabernet Sauvignon, Cabernet Franc and Merlot grapes.**
- A VIP tour and tasting at a great Grand Cru estate awaits you this morning, like Château Franc Mayne with its ancient underground cellars, or the great 1st Growths Clos Fourtet, Château Angelus or Château Canon.
- Then discover the other prestigious appellation of this area, **Pomerol**. This tiny appellation is considered the world's preeminent terroir for **Merlot**, producing wines of great character and complexity. Although it seems very understated, this appellation is home to some of the most famous cult wines, including Petrus and Le Pin.
- A tour and tasting await you today in Pomerol as you round out your week of wine discovery in the Bordeaux region.
- Following lunch on own, **explore the beautiful medieval village**, its monuments and its many shops and galleries (including some of the region's best wine shops).
- End your day with a **transfer to the train station or Bordeaux Merignac Airport**.
- Continue your journeys with fond memories of Burgundy and Bordeaux, and all their splendor.
